Parallel Workshops, 13:00 (60 minutes)

Sustainable Urban Mobility - From Vision to Action

This workshop will address how to turn sustainable mobility strategies into concrete
actions. Drawing on European best practices and ongoing projects, participants will
explore innovative approaches such as e-mobility, micro-logistics, and 15-minute cities.
The goal of this session is to help city representatives and other stakeholders identify
practical steps toward implementing sustainable urban mobility within their local
contexts. Participants will gain insight into current EU frameworks, mobility trends, and
technological innovations, and collaboratively design first ideas for local action plans
using practical worksheets.

Energy Communities and Practical Applications

Starting with an introduction to the COMMENCE project and its activities, the session then
will move into an interactive part focused on stakeholder mapping in community energy.
Participants will begin by brainstorming key stakeholders using Mentimeter, with results
displayed live. Then, in small groups, they will categorize stakeholders into a printed
matrix, fostering discussion and collaboration. Each group's outcomes will be shared in
the plenary, followed by a joint reflection and feedback. The workshop encourages
collective insight into stakeholder roles and influence in local energy systems.

Afternoon Workshop, 14:30 (120 minutes)

Communicating Climate Action Effectively

This workshop will share STEM's expertise and experience in measuring public attitudes toward climate change and the strategic communication of decarbonization to the wider public. Participants will explore evidence-based insights into public attitudes and the framing of the climate debate. The workshop will delve into practical communication strategies and best practice examples. The session will conclude with tailored individual and collective activities to apply the concepts explored. This workshop offers valuable data, communication guidance, and hands-on experience to better equip participants for climate change dialogue and public engagement.
